# Getting to Know Your iPhone

## What Is an iPhone?

A smartphone made by Apple. It combines a phone, camera, computer, and more in one device.

## iPhone Models

Various models exist with different features. Newer models have better cameras and faster processors.

## Parts of the iPhone

Screen, home button or swipe area, volume buttons, power button, charging port, and speakers.

## Touch Gestures

Tap to select, swipe to scroll, pinch to zoom in or out on photos and websites.





# Setting Up Your iPhone

## Power On/Off

Press and hold the side button to turn on. To turn off, press side button and volume button together.

## Follow Setup Wizard

The iPhone guides you through initial setup. Just follow the on-screen prompts.

## Create Apple ID

This account lets you download apps and use Apple services. You'll need an email address.

## Set Security

Choose a passcode or set up Face ID. Connect to Wi-Fi to complete setup.





# Home Screen and Navigation



## Home Screen

This is your starting point. It displays app icons, folders, and the dock at the bottom.




## App Icons and Folders

Tap an app to open it. Group similar apps in folders by dragging one app onto another.



## Control Center

Swipe down from top-right corner for quick settings like brightness, volume, and flashlight.



## Notification Center

Swipe down from the top to see alerts and notifications from your apps.

# Making and Receiving Calls



## Making Calls

Tap the Phone app icon. Enter a number or choose a contact. Tap the green call button.



## Answering Calls

When your phone rings, slide the button to answer. Press the red button to end.



## Managing Contacts

Store numbers in the Contacts app. Add new contacts by tapping the + icon.



## Voicemail

Set up voicemail in the Phone app. Tap Voicemail to listen to messages.





# Text Messaging and iMessages

## Sending Texts

Open the Messages app. Tap the new message icon. Enter a contact name or number.

Type your message in the text field. Tap the blue arrow to send.

## Adding Fun Elements


Tap the emoji icon on the keyboard to add smileys and icons.

Use the camera icon to send photos. Hold the microphone to send a voice message.

## Group Messaging

Add multiple contacts to create a group text. Everyone sees all messages.

Blue bubbles mean iMessage (Apple to Apple). Green means regular text.



# Getting Online with Safari



## Opening Safari

Tap the Safari icon (compass) on your home screen to open the web browser.



## Searching

Tap the address bar at the top. Type a website address or search term. Tap Go.



## Bookmarking

Tap the share icon. Select "Add to Bookmarks" to save websites you visit often.



## Safety Tips

Avoid entering personal information on unfamiliar sites. Look for the lock icon for secure sites.

# Using Email



## Set Up Email

Open Settings. Tap Mail. Add Account. Choose your provider.

## Send Emails

Open Mail app. Tap compose icon. Add recipient, subject, and message.

---



## Attach Files

In a new email, tap in the body area. Tap the < icon. Select "Add Attachment."

## Manage Spam

Tap "Junk" to mark suspicious emails. Delete unwanted messages by swiping left.

# Exploring the App Store

## What Are Apps?

Small programs that add functions to your phone. There are apps for games, banking, weather, and more.

## Removing Apps

Press and hold an app icon. Tap "Remove App" to delete it and free up space.



## Finding Apps

Open the App Store icon. Use the search bar or browse categories. Tap "Get" to download free apps.

## Updates

App Store shows when updates are available. Updates fix bugs and add features.

# Taking & Sharing Photos



## Open Camera

Tap the Camera app. Swipe to choose photo, video, portrait, or other modes.



## Take Photos

Aim at your subject. Tap the white button to take a photo. Hold for burst photos.



## View Photos

Tap the small thumbnail in the corner. Or open the Photos app to see all images.



## Share

In Photos, tap Share icon. Choose Messages or Mail. Select contacts and send.

# Using Siri and Voice Dictation



## What Is Siri?

Apple's voice assistant that helps you complete tasks and find information



## Activate Siri

Press and hold the side button or say "Hey Siri" if enabled



## Ask Questions


Ask about weather, set alarms, make calls, or send texts



## Voice Typing

Tap microphone on keyboard to dictate text instead of typing

# Managing Settings and Security



**The Settings app is your command center. Access it by tapping the gear icon. Here you can manage Wi-Fi, check battery health, and update your system.**

**"Find My iPhone" helps locate your device if lost. Keep your iOS updated for best security.**

# Staying Safe and Secure

## Common Scams

**Fake calls about your Apple ID**

**Text messages with strange links**

**Apps asking for too many permissions**

**Pop-ups saying your phone has a virus**

## How to Avoid

**Apple never calls about your account**

**Never click links from unknown senders**

**Only allow access that makes sense for the app**

**These are always fake - close Safari and ignore**

# Staying Connected



## Video Calls

Use FaceTime to see friends and family. Tap the FaceTime app and select a contact to call.



## Maps

Find your way with the Maps app. Search for a location and tap Directions for turn-by-turn guidance.



## Social Media

Stay in touch through apps like Facebook. Download from the App Store and sign in to your account.
